Fees

Registration fees for weekend events are due at the time of registration. A late fee may be applied to a registration completed after the registration deadline, program materials, and/or recognition items may not be available for participants with late registrations. Weekend events are conducted, and camping facilities available, regardless of weather conditions unless a government agency declares that a State of Emergency exists. If a weekend event is canceled, you will be notified.

Refund Policy

Eligible refund requests must be received in writing at least 2 weeks prior to your camp date. There will be no refunds for cancellations within 2 weeks of camp date regardless of reason except in cases of medical emergency or a Covid-19 related concern. Medical refund request must include a doctor's note. Written refund for emergencies must be received by the Outdoor Adventures team within 30 days of the event.



About Henson Scout Reservation




Richard A. Henson Scout Reservation, named for the famous aviator and philanthropist from Salisbury, Maryland has been in continuous operation by the Del-Mar-Va Council since the summer of 1965. The original name has been retained in the current facility that is called Camp Nanticoke. The 1889 acres of prime wooded pinelands is wholly owned by the

Council. The property and facilities are maintained at the highest possible standard of excellence. The beautiful natural resources of the property have been noted in the Nature Conservancy's Last Great Places campaign.

Henson Scout Reservation, Camp Nanticoke, has a long-standing reputation of maintaining a high standard program accreditation within the National Scouting framework. Evaluations are conducted annually by the Northeast Region of the BSA.

- Heated by a wood burning stove
- Kitchen including a refrigerator/freezer and propane oven/stove
- Dining tables and stools
- Outdoor fire ring
- Basketball court











Indian River Lodge

- \$370 per weekend
- Sleeps 24 (14 in main room, 1 0 in bedrooms)
- 2 full bathrooms
- Heated by electric baseboard heaters
- Kitchen including a refrigerator/freezer and electric oven/stove
- Dining tables and chairs
- Outdoor fire ring











Lasher Activities Building

- \$430 per weekend
- Sleeps 32 (28 in main room, 4 in private bedroom)
- 3 bathrooms, 2 showers
- Heated and cooled by central air system
- Kitchen including a refrigerator/freezer and propane oven/stove
- Dining tables and chairs
- Outdoor fire ring













Yurt Village

- \$430 per weekend
- Sleeps 32 (24 in main room, 8 in partitioned, semi- private space)
- 2 full bathrooms
- Heated and cooled by central air system
- Kitchen including a refrigerator/freezer and propane gas oven/stove
- Dining tables and chairs
- Outdoor tables, chairs, and fire pit













Boating Equipment Rentals



Stand Up Paddle(SUP) Boards, Canoes, and Kayaks are available for rent during the Fall and Spring for use on camp and off.

Trailers, paddles, and life jackets are all available and included in the rental fee



Canoes*: \$20 each per day

Kayaks*: \$20 each per day





*Trailers are available for an additional \$15 to transport canoes and kayaks for use offsite. SUP Boards can be transported easily in personal vehicles.

Shooting Range Rentals

*Campmasters offer Shooting Sports on several weekends throughout the year (See website for complete schedule). On these weekends, there is no range rental fee, just a nominal program fee as follows:

\$3 per person (per 20 shots) for rifle shooting

\$1 per shot for shotgun shooting

\$1.00 per person for BB's

\$2.00 per person for Archery (Cub Scout & Scouts BSA)

Units who have properly trained adult leaders are able to rent the ranges on non-shooting sports weekends. The rifle, shotgun, and archery ranges are available for \$50 each. Personal firearms, bows, and ammunition are prohibited.





Cub Scout Units can rent ranges to use BB guns, wrist rockets, or bows and arrows.



Climbing Tower Rental

- \$50 Rental Fee
- plus \$5 per climber
- Unit will be sent a bill after the event
- No age requirements- participants must be mature and well-behaved
 - · All equipment is provided







Reservations: Please reserve your campsites in advance and notify the Camp Director if you are interested in climbing. The Camp Director will contact the Climbing Program Director who will verify if the climbing facility is available and seek out appropriate staff. For this reason, please attempt to schedule a month or two in advance. We can attempt last minute reservations but the later you are scheduling, the more difficult it could be to arrange for staff. As a minimum, we need to have 2 qualified Instructors as staff, and maintain a ratio of 6 Scouts to 1 Instructor. Depending on the size of a group, some events will have 2 instructors while others with larger groups may require up to 5 or 6.
